RELEVANT PROJECT EXPERIENCE

Edinburg CISD Barrientes Middle School Addition

COST \$3.3M TO BE COMPLETED July 2015

This 20,000 sq. ft. building is currently under construction. It features CMU load bearing walls with exterior brick. The school is equipped with science labs with science casework and equipment, a fine arts department with a dance room, and sound-proof Choir, Orchestra, Band and ensemble rooms.

City of Edinburg McIntyre Streetscape Project

COST \$2.72M COMPLETED April 2014

This major street revitalization project transformed a city street into a walking trail with landscape, brick pavers and benches. The project included new drainage, sewer systems and decorative lighting for the area. Facilities included a gazebo, public restrooms and an dressing room facility.

Sharyland ISD High School 400 Building

COST \$3.7M COMPLETED July 2011

This project features a 40,000 sq. ft. building including classrooms, science labs with epoxy tops, administration area, special education classrooms, life-skills classroom, and high-tech computer labs. The building make-up was a metal building with CMU non-load bearing walls with exterior brick and metal roof panels.

Edinburg CISD Brewster Cafeteria & Football Field

COST \$3.54M COMPLETED January 2010

This project featured a stand-alone, load-bearing CMU wall building with chiller system. The cafeteria addition included new kitchen equipment and polished concrete floors. The E-Con Group, LLC demolished and rebuilt a parking area and developed a new football field with scoreboard.

South Texas College Mid-Valley Campus Nursing Lab Improvements

COST \$342K COMPLETED August 2010

This two-classroom space was built to simulate the nursing profession and train future nurses. E-Con's service included installing med-gas and all other electrical work, hospital curtains, beds and a laboratory work area.

Edinburg CISD Network Operating and IT Training Center

COST \$4.8M COMPLETED October 2009

The existing, historic 1920s-era North Jr. High structure was near ruins, but was salvaged and transformed into a modern, 25,000 sq. ft. information technology building. The projects consisted of restoring the building envelopes followed by a complete interior, systems and utility overhaul.
